Board Nominees for AGM 2020

<u>Meghan Carter</u> is a freelance paralegal who runs her own small business, working with lawyers throughout the province to provide legal support. Meghan completed her Bachelor of Arts degree in Criminology from SFU and has a criminology diploma. Prior to studying to become a paralegal, Meghan worked with the Legal Services Society assisting low income British Colombians to deal with legal issues. When not working, Meghan enjoys being outside and she can be found skiing, sailing, gardening or hiking. Meghan lives in Gibsons.

<u>**Richard Hergesheimer**</u> (Hergy) was born and raised in Saskatchewan, the son of a Lutheran pastor, and spent his working life serving congregations in the US, Montreal and the BC lower mainland. His last congregation helped to build a low-income housing project which provided affordable homes for 19 families. He retired in 2013 and he and Trudy moved to the Sunshine Coast and, in 2016 he became the part-time pastor at Living Faith Lutheran Church in Davis Bay (the little white church by the bay) which, thanks to Ed and Gwen Hawkins, had (and still has) a long history with Habitat for Humanity -- a history and relationship that Hergy hopes to continue honouring by serving on the Habitat board and family selection committee.

Kelly Keil has been in the publishing industry for most of her life, starting in the local newspaper at the age of 15, and now lives in Powell River where she is the publisher of the Powell River Peak. She has years of experience and education in graphic design, advertising, marketing, and business. If you were to ask her what her most important role is, she would tell you being a mother to her two beautiful daughters and raising them with her wonderful husband. Kelly enjoys giving back to her community and does so by volunteering and serving on the local Marine Area Business Association, and the Powell River Chamber of Commerce board, and chairing the Public Relations committee for the Powell River Rotary Club (evening chapter).

<u>Chris Pallett</u> is a self employed interior designer and lives in Sechelt on Porpoise Bay. For the past three years he has been serving on his strata council. He previously served on council in a condo building in Vancouver, and was strata president for two years. Chris buys, renovates, and sells homes - over 25 properties in the last 35 years. Professionally he works with clients to either build or renovate their homes or income properties, increasing property value along the way. In his first term on the Board of HFHSC he chaired or co-chaired various fundraising events and hopes to be able to again work on Habitat fundraising events.

Dr Marius Welgemoed qualified as a medical doctor in 2006 from the University of Pretoria in South Africa. In 2019 he was appointed as medical manager for psychiatric services on the Sunshine Coast and was recently appointed as associate local medical director for Vancouver Coastal Health Sechelt Hospital. Marius, a resident of Sechelt, has been contributing to the health care community on the Sunshine Coast and, through service with Habitat, wishes to broaden his engagement with the community.
